In 2021, Session gratefully accepted two new members into the congregation of Cooks Creek by letter of transfer. Session enthusiastically welcomes these new members and is comforted in the knowledge that they have been guided by the Holy Spirit to join Cooks Creek and that they will serve this congregation and God's kingdom faithfully in the years to come.

In 2021, Cooks Creek saw the loss in membership of four individuals who have gone to their final, eternal communion with their Savior. Session deeply appreciates the years of service these saints provided the Church, hopes their loved ones have found the comfort that God's grace provides, and rejoices in the knowledge that they are now experiencing the joys and wonders of Heaven in communion with Jesus Christ forevermore.

On November 21, at the recommendation of Session, the congregation approved a change to the bylaws of the Church that will reduce the number of active Ruling Elders from 15 to 9. This reduction will occur by reducing the number of Ruling Elders in each Sessional Class from 5 to 3, starting with the newly elected Class of 2024. As noted above, there will be 13 Ruling Elders in 2022. That number will drop to 11 in 2023 and then to 9 in 2024 and beyond. Session recommended this change to the bylaws of the Church after prayerful consideration and discussion. Session was guided in making this recommendation

as a way to provide the opportunity for and the encouragement of more meaningful and open dialogue during Session meetings. More importantly, Session hopes that this change helps ensure that the congregation views Session not as the one ruling body of the Church, but rather as a council of the Church that desires and needs the support and participation of the entire congregation as it plans for and executes its desired ministry. As such, I would encourage every member of the congregation that would like to take on a more active role in any aspect of the ministry of the Church to contact a member of Session or Rev. Seth.

I continue to be humbled and comforted that you, the congregation of Cooks Creek, and your Session have allowed me the opportunity to record the happenings of this Church over the last number of years. The work done by this Church in the name of Jesus Christ is truly amazing and can only be done through the dedication of each of us, its members. May we be comforted in the fact that God continues to bless Cooks Creek Presbyterian Church in providing us with opportunities to serve Him.

The employment and financial struggles that our nation experienced in 2020 continued throughout 2021. In spite of those struggles, the diligence of the staff and the generosity of the congregation of Cooks Creek Presbyterian Church also persisted in 2021. The Administration Team of Cooks Creek wishes to extend its gratitude to both groups for their continued support.

The staff of Cooks Creek remains exceptional. Through the guidance of Rev. Seth, Cooks Creek continued to find new and innovative ways to worship and serve our Lord, as well as serve our community, over the last year. His leadership during this time is an assurance that God does indeed answer the vigilant prayers of a congregation such as ours as we sought the call of a new pastor in 2018. Martha Shank remains steadfast in accurately maintaining our financial records and performing other critical tasks to ensure that our congregation and community stay up to date on the happenings of the Church. Jeanie Will continues to keep the Church in immaculate shape and should be commended for all she does behind the scenes. Cooks Creek is very fortunate to have Sarah Graf and Teresa Simmers lead our music programs as they enhance our worshipping experience. Kathy Lyons does a great job in ensuring that our youngest congregants are spiritually nurtured in a secure environment while under her care. On behalf of the Session and the congregation, the Administration Team offers these individuals our unwavering appreciation.

The financial state of the Church remains strong, thanks to the continued support of the congregation. The Church was able to keep expenses down during 2021, resulting in a manageable \$15,500 budgetary shortfall for the fiscal year, which was more than made up for by the gracious forethought of one special saint of the Church, whose estate bequeathed a very generous donation to the Church. Because of the contributions of the congregation, Session has been able to continue to improve the physical plant of the Church. A new oven has been purchased for the Church Kitchen, which was the final initiative from the Capital Campaign that needed to be completed. Improvements to the audio/visual equipment in the Fellowship Hall have been made. New hymnals and hand bell octaves have been purchased. Session has approved the purchase of security cameras within the Church, which should be installed soon. Session is working on finalizing other projects to further improve the worshipping opportunities at Cooks Creek.

As a result of the solid financial position of the Church, Session passed a balanced budget for 2022 that shows anticipated expenditures of \$316,347, which is a reduction of \$8,099 in budgetary expenses from 2021. The budget includes a 3% pay raise to staff across the board. The 2022 budget is included within these reports.

Congregational Care Committee serves the Lord through compassionate ministries and develops fellowship events that facilitate connections among members of our church with loving hearts and prayers.

January – December Monthly Ministry to our Church Members:

- ~Extended Outreach by contacting and praying for selected members of our congregation who are living in retirement communities or who reside in their homes.
- ~monthly meals were provided for two families experiencing health issues.
- ~meals were provided for church members who had surgeries or health issues

Children and Family Ministries:

- ~John 3:16 Valentine cards and bracelets were given to 51 children (25 families)
- ~Palm Sunday children received a HOLY WEEK JOURNEY chart
- ~Easter Sunday children received a tomb craft kit
- ~5 Newborns received a Baby's New Testament with Psalms, and a rose was placed in the sanctuary in honor of each baby's birth
 - ~Prayer Ministry continues with church members praying for a child, youth or college student throughout the year. 37 children (18 families), 26 praying church members/couples, 5 college students, 5 praying families for college students

Until late summer, CCPC followed Covid 19 protocol regulations. During the month of August church ministries and socials were planned following required wearing of masks, social distancing, and hand-sanitizing safe practices.

- ~The Sunshine Gang (formerly Golden Fellowship) met for a luncheon on August 19th, Ken Rutherford was the guest speaker. Approximately 50 church members and guests attended the event at church. On December 18th, 30+ members met at the Sipe Center in Bridgewater to see the performance 3 Redneck Tenors. Nancy and Craig Miller coordinated these events.
- ~Educators, professors, teachers, staff, and Sunday School teachers were recognized during the morning worship August 29th. Eighteen inspirational cards were mailed also.
- ~Annual Church Picnic was held on Sunday, September 19th at the West Rockingham Ruritan Park. The picnic was catered by North River Market Place and BBQ chicken prepared by Craig and Paul. Approximately 90 people were in attendance.

- ~The Hospitality Table began providing coffee and treats.
- ~CCC Policy and Procedures Manual was revised and submitted in October.
- ~Pastor Appreciation Sunday – Pastor Seth was recognized during the Children’s Sermon with cards made by the children and given a gift card from the congregation.
- ~Harvest Party after worship: grilled hamburgers/hot dogs, cider, crafts, and games.
- ~Connect Table Host attendant began on Sunday mornings from 10:15-10:30 and after worship service.

- ~Session members and Congregational Care team members who continue to keep in touch with members of the congregation so they can stay connected and feel that they are part of our church congregation.

There are many needs in our community and with the financial, physical, and prayerful support of the Cooks Creek congregation, we have helped many and continue to do so. One of our largest and most important assets is the Dick Miller Fund. After careful screening, we assisted families and individuals with various financial needs last year. Without the support of this fund, many people would have been left without housing, electricity, water, fuel oil, important medication, etc. We disbursed \$23,441.68 while helping 34 individuals/families; we declined 2 requests for assistance. Thank you for your donations to this fund, and a special thanks to Bea Morris for fielding the requests and investigative work on behalf of the team prior to us voting on each request.

We hosted Open Doors in December 2020/January 2021 and March 2021 and December 2021/January 2022 at the old Red Front Supermarket. We partnered with local churches, families, friends, and organizations to provide meals for the homeless of the area. We can't thank Linda Smith enough for lining up hot meals and insuring we have the food and supplies we need; she certainly is a blessing to this mission. A countless number of other "regulars" fill the various volunteer opportunities we have during those weeks. We appreciate all of you and thank everyone who makes this mission possible. We are proof that our love for God and His people reach far beyond the walls of our church building. In February/March, Church World Services was blessed again by our congregation sponsoring blankets in honor or memory of our loved ones. We contributed \$1,710 to bring warmth, comfort, shade, etc. that these blankets provide. Thank you to Beth Phillips who heads up this mission for us.

This summer we financially sponsored Tori Moats as she traveled to Mexico doing mission work. We are so proud of her for following her heart and her passion for helping others.

We expanded our outreach in 2021 by participating in the Baby Hope project established by Hope Distributed. We collected diapers, wipes, burp cloths, etc. for babies in need in September and October. Your generous donations overflowed the play pen we used as a collection receptacle. They were certainly overwhelmed and appreciative of the support from our church.

We'd like to thank those that donated food, contribute funds, ordered food, made the monthly grocery run, registered recipients, packed bags, pulled wagons, delivered emergency food, etc. at the West Rockingham Food Pantry. We used funds from the 4 Cents a Meal offering to provide the eggs distributed in November, our church's host month. Special thanks to Gloria Miller for the devotion sent home with each food recipient as well. This ministry is certainly a blessing to those in our community that are food insecure and the good folks of Cooks Creek are a driving force behind it.

Our congregation again took the responsibility of ringing the bell for the Salvation Army Kettle Drive in July for the "Christmas in July" and on December 11th and 18th at the Shenandoah Heritage Farmers Market. We thank all those that volunteered an hour of their time.

The children of our Circleville Mission were blessed with gifts of warm clothing this past Christmas. Thanks to those who purchased clothing to fill the need and bring smiles to the children's faces. Special thanks to Randy and Viv Burkholder and Jeff and Jenny Heatwole for your dedication to this mission.

Our Back-Pack Mission, where food is sent home on Fridays with students who normally would have little/nothing to eat over the weekends, was modified slightly this year. We chose to support the TAHS and WPMS's programs again with funds from the 4 Cents a Meal offering by providing the side dishes and desserts for a Christmas meal sent home for the long holiday break where free meals at school wouldn't be available. A local poultry company provided turkeys to accompany our donation. We fed 38 families from these two schools over the Christmas holiday.

The Christmas Eve special offering of \$3785 went to Presbyterian Disaster Assistance. Thank you for your donations to this fund considering the recent devastation caused by tornados in Kentucky and surrounding areas.

It takes the work of many for our mission and outreach to be successful. We appreciate all the dedication and talent everyone brings to the table. 2021 was another tough year indeed, but we are prayerful that 2022 will certainly bring us more opportunities to show God's love. Are you ready?

- October 31st: A Harvest party was held in the Fellowship Hall with hamburgers, hot dogs, apple cider, pumpkin painting, face painting, fall treats and a bouncy house. It was refreshing to see our children take part in the joy of the Thanksgiving season.
- December 19th: Our worship service centered around "Lessons and Carols" which was a unique opportunity for members to take part reading scriptures from the Book of Isaiah. We participated both in person and virtually. Old familiar carols added to the experience.
- On December 26th, we met casually in the Fellowship Hall for coffee and donuts. After a fun table game, Pastor Seth had a brief Bible study about ancient Roman society and government at the time Christ came onto the scene.
